A typical trip to Fargo for an appointment takes an average of 3-5 hours, depending on the location of the recipient. Volunteers can participate on a short-term basis (such as 3-4 months out of the year) or on a long-term basis. Community of Care also provides services in:

- Yard work
- Minor household repairs

- Friendly visits
- Light housekeeping
- Social transportation
- Assistance with errands

Are you 70 ½ and must take the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA?

In 2013, a direct rollover from your IRA can be made to charitable organizations. The rollover amount can be your entire RMD or a portion of it. The amount rolled over to the charitable organization will be TAX FREE.

### Endowment Fund

The C of C Board of Directors is working to establish an Endowment Fund prior to the end of 2013. North Dakota residents receive a 40% tax break for individuals, couples or businesses who make a \$5,000 gift to a qualified endowment. After the foderal % state tax

ment. After the federal & state tax savings, the gift actually costs the giver approximately 43% of the total donation. - Monthly blood pressure the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of every month in the Arthur Mall
- Bone Builders exercise class on Mondays & Thursdays 10—11 AM at Arthur Good Sam. This class promotes balance and strength.
- After discharge from a hospital setting, Jess provides support and wellness checks.
- Prayer and support for community members and parishioners experiencing difficult situations
- Call our Arthur office if you know of someone who would benefit from a Faith Community Nurse visit.

Community of Care believes rural Cass County is a great place to live, no matter what your age! We provide services free of charge for your family, friends and neighbors in rural Cass County. Our goal is "to enhance the quality of life for rural Cass County residents in order to keep them in their homes and communities as long as safely possible." This is one example of the many rural Cass residents we serve:

Roger and Betty (not their real names) have been married for 57 years and have lived in their rural Cass home their entire married life. They call our office frequently for transportation to medical appointments; our Volunteer Coordinator facilitates rides provided by local volunteers. Our Social Worker recently helped them complete a fuel assistance form and reviewed their Medicare Part D drug plan. Our Faith Community Nurse does outreach visits to Roger and Betty to check their blood pressure and assess their home for safety issues. Roger and Betty tell us they are able to remain in their home because of the services Community of Care provides. They also report that our services give them peace of mind.

On behalf of the board of directors, staff and clients of Community of Care, we want to thank you for your support of our mission during our first ten years! The contributions of many individuals, businesses and organizations allow us to continue serving rural Cass County residents. As a community-based organization, we rely on the concept of *neighbor helping neighbor*.
