We recently asked several of our clients two questions and recorded their answers. Here are just a few of their answers to the questions:


Why do you want to remain in your home and community?





In September, Community of Care will be celebrating our 15th anniversary. An idea that began in 2003 has continued to grow and expand. We have added programs and services during those 15 years, but most importantly, we have continued to serve a great number of older adults and client needs in rural Cass County. It is very common for our clients to receive multiple services. They might re-

What do I need to know when I turn 65?

Are you turning 65 and wondering what you need to do regarding Medicare? Here are some helpful pointers:

- 1) Medicare has 4 letters for your coverage
 - Part A covers hospitalization, surgery, etc.
 - Part B covers doctor visits, some preventative services, etc.
 - Part C is an Advantage Plan (not commonly selected)
 - Part D covers prescription drugs
- 2) You have a 7 month time frame for your Medicare Initial Enrollment Period
 - The 3 months before you turn 65
 - The month you turn 65
 - The 3 months after you turn 65

- 3) You should contact the Social Security office to sign up for Medicare and Social Security
- 4) A supplement plan assists in covering the hospital-



- ization. Talk to your insurance agent about supplement plans
- 5) You will need to select a Medicare Part D plan for 2019 during open enrollment (Oct. 15th—Dec. 7th). Community of Care will be providing appointments during open enrollment in Arthur, Buffalo, Casselton, Harwood, Horace and Kindred.

New Medicare cards are being mailed to all beneficiaries (started in April). Some important information to remember:

 The cards are automatically mailed, you do not need to do anything to receive your card

- Your new card will include a randomly assigned Medicare Beneficiary Identifier made up of 11 letters and numbers. Your Social Security number will no longer be listed on the Medicare Card
- Your benefits will not change with the new card
- When your new card arrives, be sure to update your information with your doctor
- If you receive a phone call asking for personal information to authenticate or verify your card, DO NOT GIVE OUT PERSONAL INFORMATION—HANG UP. Medicare already has that information and will not call you.
