# From the Director

During 2013, Community of Care began using a new marketing slogan, "We Drive Miss Daisy." The slogan was well-received and brought an "aha" moment to area residents. This fun slogan helps people understand some of the services we

provide at C of Care. For many of our clients, if these rides to medical appointments were not available, it would greatly increase the likelihood they would need to move out of their rural homes.

Our goal at C of Care is "to enhance the quality of life for rural Cass County residents in order to keep them in their homes and communities as long as safely possible." Providing rides for "Miss Daisy", and for "Mr. Smith" is one aspect of our program-

ming focused on that goal.

2013 included growth and opportunities. As we celebrated our 10th anniversary, we continued to serve more rural Cass residents with a wider range of programs. The addition of the Wellness Fair with UND. the growth in client contacts, exercise programs and a UND clinical student project provided additional services towards that goal.

In May we adopted a new mission statement "Caring for people by partnering with rural communities." The support and partnership of local residents continues to be crucial to our mission. The local residents who serve as volunteers, provide financial support or encourage friends & neighbors to utilize our services are important partners in our mission. We are very grateful for their support.

- Total savings was \$101,317.52
- Average savings per client was \$411.86

### **VOLUNTEER PROGRAM**

The Volunteer Program saw a change in staff with Lucille Kingsley's retirement in February and the hiring of Sandy Dooley in March.

Sandy recruited 18 new volunteers in 2013. Sustaining our volunteer pool is crucial to our ability to provide medical transportation services.

The addition of these new volunteers has increased our total number of volunteers and helped to replace previous volunteers who are no longer providing transportation. The following Volunteer Program services were provided in 2013:

- 13,144 miles driven & 667.5 hours provided for Medical Transportation
- 965.5 hours of other Volunteer Services (Day of Caring, Page Day of Service, Exercise Classes, Committees, Wellness Fairs, Fundraisers, etc.)
- 6,619 miles driven & 504.5 hours of service provided by Board of Directors
- Total economic impact of all volunteers services was \$56,733.31 in 2013

The focus of the Faith Community Nurse is the intentional care of the spirit, assisting the members of the community to maintain and/or regain wholeness in body, mind and spirit.

### **Faith Community Nurse Program**

Our Faith Community Nurse, Jess Donegan, provides outreach visits to area residents and coordinates the Bone Builder class in Arthur. She also provides Blood Pressure Screenings at the Arthur and Casselton Seniors once a month and works with local volunteers to provide BP checks in area congregations. The Wellness Fair with UND was an outreach of our FCN program. In 2014, we hope to expand the BP checks to additional congregations in northern Cass and add Bone Builder classes in Casselton and/or Kindred.

### 1st Annual Community Wellness Fair



Saturday, April 12, 2014 at the Northern Cass School.




